Executive Director Transition

The Faith in Action National Network regretfully accepted Nancy Sutton's resignation in July. Nancy brought a wealth of experience as the National Network's first Executive Director. She came on board at the beginning of 2011, and during her short tenure she secured a \$50,000 grant from The Robert Wood Johnson Foundation, oversaw the development of our new website, brought state charitable filings up-to-date, and spent many hours on the phone addressing challenges of local programs and encouraging communities interested in starting a new volunteer caregiver program.

While the search is underway for a new Executive Director, the Board of Directors has appointed Jan Irish to serve in the interim. Jan served on the *Faith in Action* National Network's Board since March of 2008. She resigned from the Board on August 1, 2011, to accept the position as interim Executive Director. Jan was the Director of *Faith in Action* in Newberg, Oregon, from its inception in 1995 until she retired in 2010. Chicago National Conference A Big Success

Faith in Action program staff and volunteers gathered in Chicago on August 1, 2, and 3 to celebrate "Volunteers: The Power of the Compassionate Heart." All those attending were touched by the stories of how volunteers have impacted the lives of the elderly and those with long-term, chronic illnesses throughout the country.

Conference attendees were motivated by **keynote speaker Luther K. Snow as they learned to look at their communities with cups that are half full.** Luther led participants through the identification of assets and connecting dots between those assets, then had them "vote with their feet" to select projects that were of interest to them.

Susan McCoy closed the conference with an inspirational presentation to encourage and uplift caregivers. Speaking from her personal experience, Susan touched the hearts of everyone with her openness, compassion, and reflection of her own caregiving experiences.

Conference participants had the opportunity to learn about social networking, fundraising, working with congregations, recruiting volunteers, and a wide variety of other topics in breakout workshops. There were times for sharing, networking, and building friendships.

The **First Annual Volunteer Recognition Banquet** was held on August 2. Twelve programs nominated local volunteers for the Outstanding Volunteer of the Year Award. The winner of the Award was Margery Tonks of Interfaith Caregiver Project of Christiansted, Virgin Islands. This 93-year-old "Living Legend" has "donned her caregiver hat and worn it proudly for fifteen years, giving and receiving, teaching and learning, all in the name of commitment and dedication." Says Elisa McKay, Project Director for Interfaith Volunteer Caregiver Project, "We want to be like Marge Tonks when we grow up!"

Alzheimer's/Dementia Topic of September Webinar

Mr. Michael Verde, Founder and President of Memory Bridge: The Foundation for Alzheimer's and Cultural Memory, will present a webinar in September on behalf of the National Network. Memory Bridge creates programs that connect people with Alzheimer's disease and related dementias to family, friends, and other people in their local community. They also create programs that reveal to the general public the depths of memory that dementia does not erase.

Since the establishment of Memory Bridge in 2004, the organization has created an

interview guide used by the Library of Congress Veteran's History Project, designed and implemented an award-winning curriculum and school program called "The Memory Bridge Initiative," produced a PBS documentary entitled *There is a Bridge*, and launched an art exhibit called "Mapping Lives: The Art of Listening."

We know you will want to join us in September as Michael tells us more about how Memory Bridge can help us provide a higher quality of services to our care receivers. 
My program joined the National Network because we believe in the value of neighbors helping neighbors, and we wanted to be part of the volunteer caregiving movement across the nation.
