"I was sick and I didn't know it. Without the help of Faith in Action I would not be able to get to my dialysis appointments and pick up my medications every week." Albert now gets rides to and from dialysis 3 days per week from FIA volunteers. "I've never seen so many people that are nice and kind in one spot."
